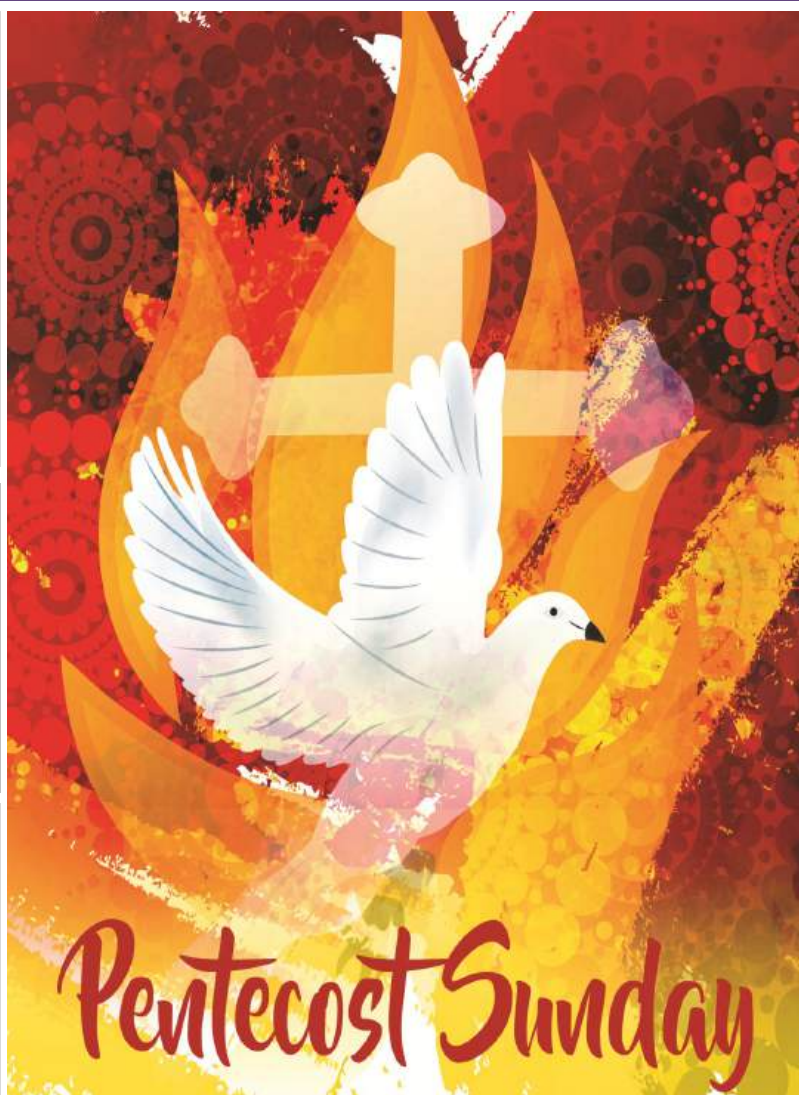

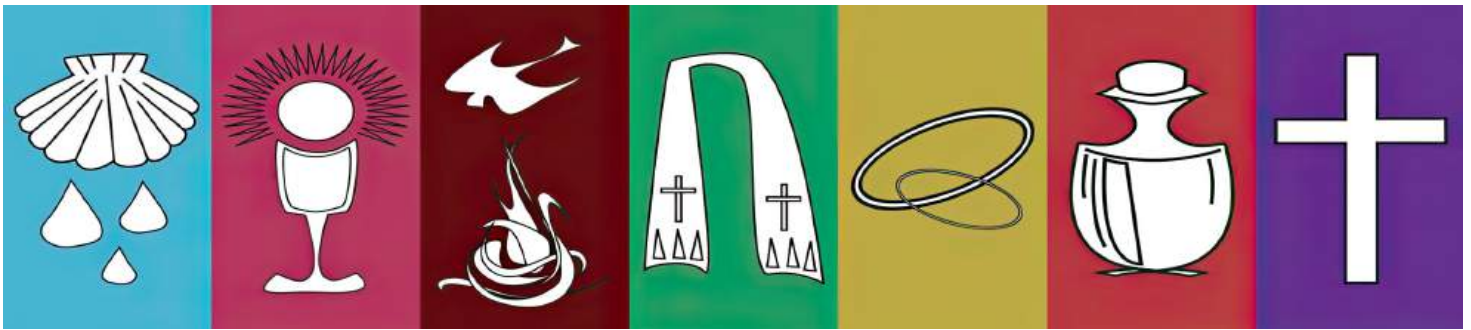

Dear friends, on this Pentecost Sunday I leave you with one of my favorite reflections on the Holy Spirit from St. Cyril of Jerusalem (c. 315-386 A.D)

From a catechetical instruction by Saint Cyril of Jerusalem, bishop

The living water of the Holy Spirit

The water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of living water, welling up into eternal life. This is a new kind of water, a living, leaping water, welling up for those who are worthy. But why did Christ call the grace of the Spirit water? Because all things are dependent on water; plants and animals have their origin in water. Water comes down from heaven as rain, and although it is always the same in itself, it produces many different effects, one in the palm tree, another in the vine, and so on throughout the whole of creation. It does not come down, now as one thing, now as another, but while remaining essentially the same, it adapts itself to the needs of every creature that receives it.

In the same way the Holy Spirit, whose nature is always the same, simple and indivisible, apportions grace to each man as he wills. Like a dry tree which puts forth shoots when watered, the soul bears the fruit of holiness when repentance has made it worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit. Although the Spirit never changes, the effects of this action, by the will of God and in the name of Christ, are both many and marvelous.

The Spirit makes one man a teacher of divine truth, inspires another to prophesy, gives another the power of casting out devils, enables another to interpret holy Scripture. The Spirit strengthens one man's self-control, shows another how to help the poor, teaches another to fast and lead a life of asceticism, makes another oblivious to the needs of the body, trains another for martyrdom. His action is different in different people, but the Spirit himself is always the same. In each person, Scripture says, the Spirit reveals his presence in a particular way for the common good.

The Spirit comes gently and makes himself known by his fragrance. He is not felt as a burden, for he is light, very light. Rays of light and knowledge stream before him as he approaches. The Spirit comes with the tenderness of a true friend and protector to save, to heal, to teach, to counsel, to strengthen, to console. The Spirit comes to enlighten the mind first of the one who receives him, and then, through him, the minds of others as well.

As light strikes the eyes of a man who comes out of darkness into the sunshine and enables him to see clearly things he could not discern before, so light floods the soul of the man counted worthy of receiving the Holy Spirit and enables him to see things beyond the range of human vision, things hitherto undreamed of.



Queridos amigos, en este Domingo de Pentecostés les dejo una de mis reflexiones favoritas sobre el Espíritu Santo, de San Cirilo de Jerusalén (c. 315-386 d. C.).

De las Catequesis de san Cirilo de Jerusalén, obispo

El agua que yo le dé se convertirá en él en manantial de agua viva, que brota para comunicar vida eterna. Se nos habla aquí de un nuevo género de agua, un agua viva y que brota; pero que brota sólo sobre los que son dignos de ella. Mas, ¿por qué el Señor da el nombre de agua a la gracia del Espíritu? Porque el agua es condición necesaria para la pervivencia de todas las cosas, porque el agua es el origen de las plantas y de los seres vivos, porque el agua de la lluvia baja del cielo, porque, deslizándose en un curso siempre igual, produce efectos diferentes. Diversa es, en efecto, su virtualidad en una palmera o en una vid, aunque en todos es ella quien lo hace todo; ella es siempre la misma, en cualquiera de sus manifestaciones, pues la lluvia, aunque cae siempre del mismo modo, se acomoda a la estructura de los seres que la reciben, dando a cada uno de ellos lo que necesitan.

De manera semejante, el Espíritu Santo, siendo uno solo y siempre el mismo e indivisible, reparte a cada uno sus gracias según su beneplácito. Y, del mismo modo que el árbol seco, al recibir el agua, germina, así también el alma pecadora, al recibir del Espíritu Santo el don del arrepentimiento, produce frutos de justicia. Siendo él, pues, siempre igual y el mismo, produce diversos efectos, según el beneplácito de Dios y en el nombre de Cristo.

En efecto, se sirve de la lengua de uno para comunicar la sabiduría; a otro le ilumina la mente con el don de profecía; a éste le da el poder de ahuyentar los demonios; a aquél le concede el don de interpretar las Escrituras. A uno lo confirma en la temperancia; a otro lo instruye en lo pertinente a la misericordia; a éste le enseña a ayunar y a soportar el esfuerzo de la vida ascética; a aquél a despreciar las cosas corporales; a otro más lo hace apto para el martirio. Así, se manifiesta diverso en cada uno, permaneciendo él siempre igual en sí mismo, tal como está escrito: A cada uno se le otorga la manifestación del Espíritu para común utilidad.

Su actuación en el alma es suave y apacible, su experiencia es agradable y placentera y su yugo es levisimo. Su venida va precedida de los rayos brillantes de su luz y de su ciencia. Viene con la bondad de genuino protector; pues viene a salvar, a curar, a enseñar, a aconsejar, a fortalecer, a consolar, a iluminar, en primer lugar, la mente del que lo recibe y, después, por las obras de éste, la mente de los demás.

Y, del mismo modo que el que se hallaba en tinieblas, al salir el sol, recibe su luz en los ojos del cuerpo y contempla con toda claridad lo que antes no veía, así también al que es hallado digno del don del Espíritu Santo se le ilumina el alma y, levantado por encima de su razón natural, ve lo que antes ignoraba.

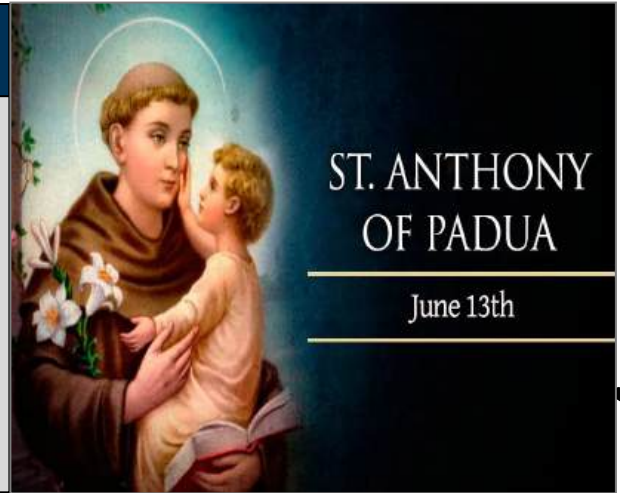

Saint Anthony of Padua's Story

The gospel call to leave everything and follow Christ was the rule of Saint Anthony of Padua's life. Over and over again, God called him to something new in his plan. Every time Anthony responded with renewed zeal and self-sacrificing to serve his Lord Jesus more completely.

His journey as the servant of God began as a very young man when he decided to join the Augustinians in Lisbon, giving up a future of wealth and power to be a servant of God. Later when the bodies of the first Franciscan martyrs went through the Portuguese city where he was stationed, he was again filled with an intense longing to be one of those closest to Jesus himself: those who die for the Good News.

So Anthony entered the Franciscan Order and set out to preach to the Moors. But an illness prevented him from achieving that goal. He went to Italy and was stationed in a small hermitage where he spent most of his time praying, reading the Scriptures and doing menial tasks.

The call of God came again at an ordination where no one was prepared to speak. The humble and obedient Anthony hesitantly accepted the task. The years of searching for Jesus in prayer, of reading sacred Scripture and of serving him in poverty, chastity, and obedience had prepared Anthony to allow the Spirit to use his talents. Anthony's sermon was astounding to those who expected an unprepared speech and knew not the Spirit's power to give people words.

Recognized as a great man of prayer and a great Scripture and theology scholar, Anthony became the first friar to teach theology to the other friars. Soon he was called from that post to preach to the Albigensians in France, using his profound knowledge of Scripture and theology to convert and reassure those who had been misled by their denial of Christ's divinity and of the sacraments.

After he led the friars in northern Italy for three years, he made his headquarters in the city of Padua. He resumed his preaching and began writing sermon notes to help other preachers. In the spring of 1231 Anthony withdrew to a friary at Camposampiero where he had a sort of treehouse built as a hermitage. There he prayed and prepared for death.

On June 13, he became very ill and asked to be taken back to Padua, where he died after receiving the last sacraments. Anthony was canonized less than a year later and named a Doctor of the Church in 1946.

La historia de San Antonio de Padua

El llamado del Evangelio a dejarlo todo y seguir a Cristo fue la norma de vida de San Antonio de Padua. Una y otra vez, Dios lo llamó a algo nuevo en su plan. En cada ocasión, Antonio respondió con renovado celo y abnegación para servir a su Señor Jesús con mayor plenitud.

Su camino como siervo de Dios comenzó siendo muy joven, cuando decidió unirse a los Agustinos en Lisboa, renunciando a un futuro de riqueza y poder para ser siervo de Dios. Más tarde, cuando los cuerpos de los primeros mártires franciscanos pasaron por la ciudad portuguesa donde estaba destinado, volvió a sentir un intenso anhelo de ser uno de los más cercanos a Jesús: aquellos que mueren por la Buena Nueva.

Así pues, Antonio ingresó en la Orden Franciscana y se dispuso a predicar a los moros. Pero una enfermedad le impidió lograrlo. Partió hacia Italia y fue destinado a una pequeña ermita donde pasó la mayor parte del tiempo rezando, leyendo las Escrituras y realizando tareas domésticas.

El llamado de Dios se presentó de nuevo en una ordenación donde nadie estaba preparado para hablar. El humilde y obediente Antonio aceptó la tarea con vacilación. Los años de búsqueda de Jesús en oración, de lectura de las Sagradas Escrituras y de servirle en pobreza, castidad y obediencia lo habían preparado para permitir que el Espíritu usara sus talentos. El sermón de Antonio asombró a quienes esperaban un discurso improvisado y desconocían el poder del Espíritu para dar palabras a la gente.

Reconocido como un gran hombre de oración y un gran estudioso de las Escrituras y la teología, Antonio se convirtió en el primer fraile en enseñar teología a los demás frailes. Pronto fue llamado desde ese puesto para predicar a los albigenses en Francia, utilizando su profundo conocimiento de las Escrituras y la teología para convertir y tranquilizar a quienes habían sido engañados por su negación de la divinidad de Cristo y de los sacramentos.

Tras tres años de liderazgo fraile en el norte de Italia, fijó su cuartel general en Padua. Reanudó su predicación y comenzó a escribir notas para sermones para ayudar a otros predicadores. En la primavera de 1231, Antonio se retiró a un monasterio en Camposampiero, donde mandó construir una especie de casa en un árbol a modo de ermita. Allí oró y se preparó para la muerte.

El 13 de junio, enfermó gravemente y pidió que lo llevaran de regreso a Padua, donde falleció tras recibir los últimos sacramentos. Antonio fue canonizado menos de un año después y nombrado Doctor de la Iglesia en 1946.

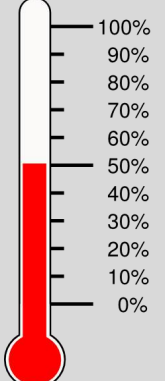

Seven Sisters Apostolate

The parish is exploring the establishment of a **Seven Sisters Apostolate**. It is a Eucharistic association of women who feel called to strengthen the Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest.

The initial recipient when a Seven Sisters group is formed in a parish should be their parish priests.

The group's intention is directed towards the office of the shepherd more than the individual. In other words, the group prays for the priest until he is reassigned, at which time his successor becomes the recipient of those prayers. This helps us to guard against an undue attachment to a certain priest.

Each member commits to a Holy Hour on a distinct day of the week, thus covering a complete week. The commitment is to that day; the Seven Sister may pray at any time on that day. If she is unable to offer her Holy Hour, she is to secure a substitute, explaining the Apostolate's mission. The substitute need not be a woman.

The Holy Hour is ideally prayed in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament – either in an Adoration Chapel or in front of a Tabernacle – but not restricted to such places. One can also pray a Holy Hour in one's home.

This generous commitment of one hour per week of prayer is asked for a period of one year, but can remain open-ended in time as each individual discerns her call to continue.

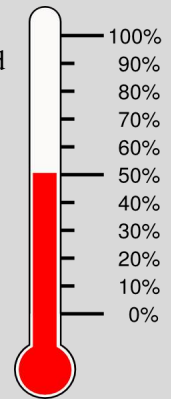

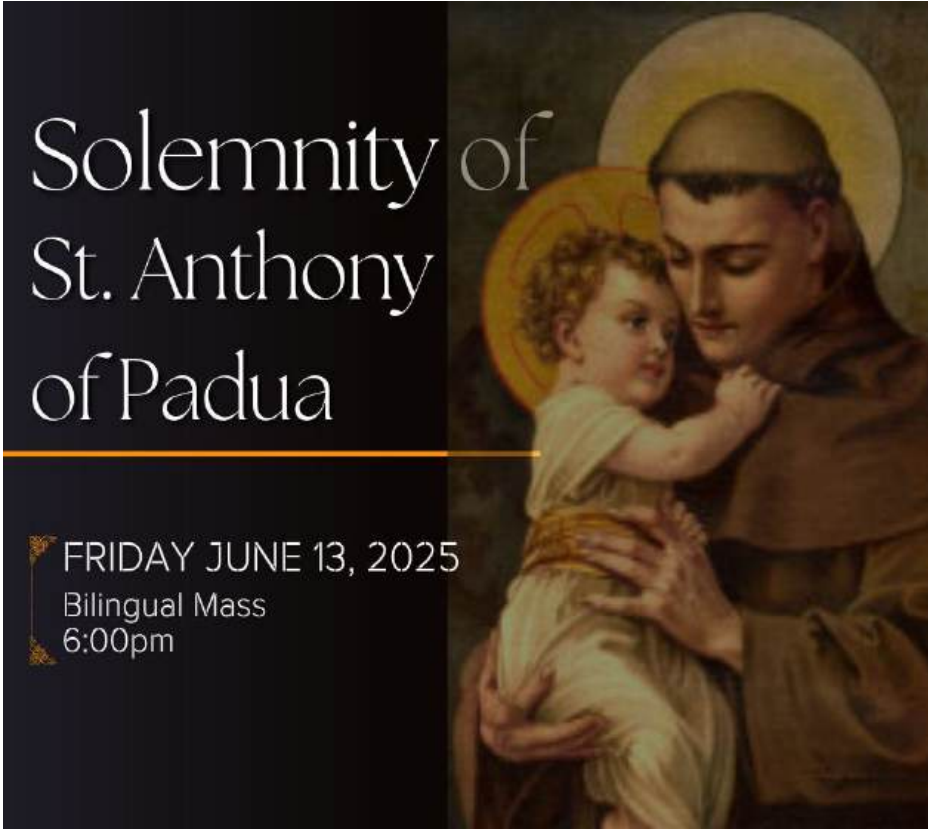

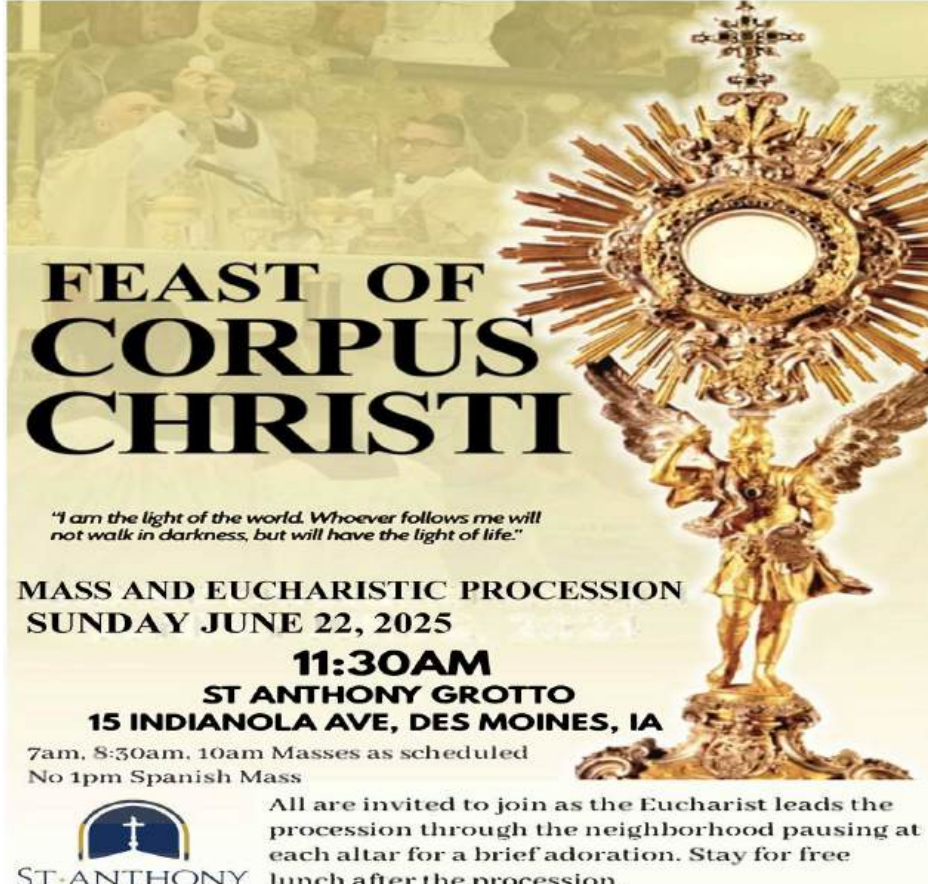
